Yard Waste

The City recently entered into a new five year contract with Best Way Disposal for residential rubbish, recycling and yard waste. By popular demand, the new agreement extends yard waste collection each year – collection will now begin on March 15 and continue through December 15.

Engineering Update

Lead Service Line Replacements funding through the FY22 and FY23 Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) is coming to a close. As a result, lead service line replacements will pause, with the exception of emergencies, until additional funding is secured. The City has applied for FY25 DWSRF funding and expects to be informed of a decision later this summer.

The Upton Drive Reconstruction Project, which includes full reconstruction of Upton Drive from the southerly limits near the St. Joseph River to Momany Drive, is underway and expected to continue through the fall.

The 2024 Sidewalk Replacement Project is underway, predominantly in the northwest quadrant of the City (north of Central Avenue and west of Main Street/M63).

The Combined Sewer Overflow (CSO) Early Action Project is scheduled to begin as early as October. This project includes the installation of new a sewer pipe from Public Works through Pri Mar Petroleum and slightly into Pier 33 property. Broad Street, in front of Public Works, will be closed for part of the project. Work is expected to be complete by May 2025.

Design work is underway on the reconstruction of Botham Avenue from South State Street to Niles Avenue and resurfacing of Cleveland Avenue from Hilltop Road to Lakeshore Drive. Work on both of the roads is proposed in the 2025 construction season.

Temporary Sign Regulations

Remember that temporary signs have restrictions! A temporary sign is any sign posted or displayed for a limited amount of time, such as banners, construction signs, garage sale signs and political signs.

One and two-family dwellings are allowed to display not more than 24 square feet of signage at any time. Signs must remain on private property. The maximum height for each sign is four feet and the size may not exceed six square feet.

Upcoming Primary Elections

Primary elections will be held in the City of St. Joseph on Tuesday, August 6, 2024.

Early voting will be offered again at Lake Michigan College Todd Center, 2785 E Napier Ave, Benton Harbor, MI 49022. Early voting will run from Saturday, July 27, through Sunday, August 4, 2024, from 8:30 AM to 4:30 PM, with the exception of Wednesday, July 31, 2024, which will run from 11 AM to 7 PM.

Absentee voting has already begun. Ballots can be requested in person at City Hall, by phone at 269-983-6325, or online at Michigan.gov/vote.

The last day to have an absentee ballot mailed to you is Friday, August 2nd. The last day to pick up an absentee ballot from the City Clerk's Office is Monday, August 5th, at 4 PM.

St. Joseph City will hold office hours on Saturday, August 3, 2024, from 7 AM to 3 PM. During these hours, residents can register to vote or receive an absentee ballot.

Absentee ballots returned to City Hall by 8 PM on August 6 will be counted.

Election Day hours in all precincts are 7 AM to 8 PM.
